Specifications: Artist may submit two works of art including painting, printmaking, sculpture. No student or class work. No photography, digital, installations, performance, or video art will be accepted. NO WORK previously exhibited in Berks County venues in the past year will be accepted. We have the right to refuse any art work upon submission that is deemed inappropriate or of substandard quality or craftsmanship.

<u>Two-dimensional work</u> - size limitation of 50 inches in any direction, and ready to hang. <u>Three-dimensional</u> - we have a variety of pedestal sizes; you can provide your own if it is suitable. Three-dimensional work weight limit of 100 pounds. No hazardous edges.

About Dr. Gaige:

Known to many as a visionary leader, Dr. Frederick Gaige served as Dean and CEO of Penn State Berks from 1984-2001, transforming the campus into a college with four-year degree programs and residence halls. Gaige was a noted scholar in the field of South Asian studies and became an expert on Nepal, where he did research on a Fulbright Fellowship from 1966-1968. He returned to Nepal as a Fulbright Lecturer in 1983 and, in 1991, he served as a consultant to the U.S. Agency for International Development on the first democratic elections in Nepal. Gaige earned his doctoral degree in South Asian studies from the University of Pennsylvania in 1970.

Professor Woodward is on the Board of Humane PA, and a volunteer at the Humane Society of Berks County.

Ann Lalik - is the Gallery Director and Arts
Coordinator Penn State Lehigh Valley, Center
Valley PA and an instructor in metalsmithing. She
received her MFA from Tyler School of Art,
Temple University, Summa Cum Laude in 1988.
Prior to that, she was the Executive Director of the
Baum School of art, Allentown, 2006 to 2009 and
Director of their Educational Programs & Gallery
Exhibitions January 1988-December 2005.
