BURSAR

What is the Bursar?

• The Office of the Bursar is responsible for maintaining student accounts pertaining to tuition billing, acceptance fees, charges, payments, posting of Financial Aid, and refunds (when applicable).

Which payment forms are accepted by the Bursar?

• This office accepts student payments in a variety of forms including via E-check & credit card through LionPATH, cash, check, or money order/certified check.

When are Fall 2021 bills due?

- Billing begins in August for the Fall semester with a due date of 8/30/21. Due dates can be found here.
- If you have scheduled your classes prior to July 31, 2021, your statement can be viewed in LionPATH now.
 - If you have not scheduled your classes yet, please contact your academic adviser to do so. Once your classes are scheduled, your statement will be available to view in LionPATH during the first week of September with a due date of 9/22/21.
 - Note, if you register for classes on or after 8/30/21, you may be charged a \$250 late registration fee.

Is there a payment plan?

- Students may enroll in the Installment Payment Plan (IPP), allowing payments in increments over 4 months. More information about the IPP can be found here.
- Note, if you do not have a statement (due to scheduling courses after July 31) but would like to enroll into the IPP, you will need to wait until your statement is available during the first week of September to enroll into the plan.
 - When enrolling in the IPP in September, half of the balance due is required at the time of enrollment. Please note that there is a \$45 enrollment fee.

NAVIGATING FINANCES: FINANCIAL AID

What is the financial Aid Office?

The Financial Aid Office is responsible for the awarding and disbursement of financial aid.

This is the office students contact if they have been selected for **verification**, have questions about the **FAFSA**, and/or want to know their **aid amount and type** (e.g., loans, scholarships, grants).

Important note: Penn State cannot meet the full financial need of all students. Students and their families/supporters have the primary responsibility of paying tuition and other costs. **Education <u>loans</u> comprise the largest percentage of all available student aid.**

What is SAP?

Satisfactory Academic Progress is reviewed yearly and determines a student's Federal financial aid eligibility.


SAP: Two Key Factors

- Cumulative GPA of a 2.00 or higher
- Completion rate of 67% or higher. This means passing 67% of the TOTAL credits (not courses) you have ever attempted at Penn State.

What is Verification?

Verification is a federal regulation that requires colleges and universities to verify the information provided by students and parents on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

- If you completed the 2021-2022 FAFSA, you may see verification requests in LionPATH in your HOLDS or TO-DO List. <u>Complete all requests as soon as</u> <u>possible!</u>
- The requests will be for the "2022" aid year in LionPATH. For questions about verification, learn more <u>here</u>

WALK-IN ADVISING

- Students can meet with an academic adviser virtually or in-person between August 23 27 from 8:00am 4:00pm.

 - **In-person drop-in:** Come to the office and sign in for a walk-in appointment. You will have the option to meet with an adviser virtually or in-person.
- Reasons to meet with an adviser during the first week of classes
 - Verify that your course schedule satisfies your major's and/or minor's requirements
 - Add courses
 - Remove courses

- At Penn State Berks, students can enroll in one of our 21 baccalaureate degrees, one of our 4 associate degree programs, or complete the first two years of more than 275+ baccalaureate degree programs offered by Penn State.

- A student's academic course load will impact their degree progression and financial aid eligibility.
 - To be considered a full-time student, you must enroll (and maintain for the duration of the semester) at least 12 credits.
 - To be considered a part-time student, you must enroll (and maintain for the duration of the semester) between 6 and 11 credits.

- **TIP:** Review your Fall 2021 course schedule in LionPATH within the first two days of the semester. If you are not enrolled in the minimum number of credits needed (based on your preferred part-time or full-time status) meet with an academic adviser before the first Friday of the semester to adjust your schedule!
