## DID YOU KNOW?

### **Alternative Grading**

Things to know about Fall 2020 Alternative Grading...

- Alternative grades do <u>not</u> negatively impact your GPA.
- Between <u>Dec 23 and Jan 12</u>, in LionPATH students can elect to keep their letter grade as earned OR use alternative grades for their course(s).
- There are three types of alternative grades
  - SAT: original course letter grade of C or higher
  - V: original course letter grade of D
  - Z: original course letter grade of F
- If a student has an <u>Academic Integrity violation</u> in a course, they will not be able to use alternative grading in that course.
- Potential drawbacks
  - Could impact scholarships, Financial Aid, and entrance to other education institutions
  - Students may NOT be able to use alternative grades for entrance to major in administratively controlled majors
  - Impact to Dean's list attainment and graduating with honors

## **Spring 2021 Course Enrollment**

- There is still time to meet with your Academic Adviser to plan your Spring courses!
- Remember, the sooner you schedule next semester's courses, the more likely you are to get the courses you want/need!

  - Holds, To-Do List items, and/or having an unpaid balance may prevent you from scheduling classes for next semester.
  - Connect with Financial Aid, Bursar, and any other office as necessary to ensure all issues are resolved before you schedule.

#### 2021-2022 FAFSA

REMINDER: FAFSA for 2021-2022 opened <u>Oct 1, 2020!</u>

- You can file your 2021-2022
   FAFSA by <u>clicking here</u>
- PA residents, submit BEFORE May
   1, 2021 to be considered for the PHEAA State grant.
- Have your 2019 tax info.

If you have already completed the 2021-2022 FAFSA, you may begin seeing verification requests starting in December. The requests will be for the aid year of 2022 in LionPATH.

#### **DO NOT LOSE YOUR AID!**

If you have not completed your verification items for the 2020-2021 FAFSA (aid year 2021 in LionPATH), you could be at risk of losing your federal aid for the entire academic year.

- You MUST return all To Do List items in LionPATH to the Office of Student Aid (OSA) as soon as possible.
- Once OSA reviews your submitted materials, that MAY trigger new items for review.
- If the verification is not completed by the last week of classes, you will lose your federal aid for the year (Fall 2020 AND Spring 2021)!

## A Berks Bite: Rolo Pretzel Delights





#### Supplies

- One bag small square pretzels
- One bag of Rolos (you will need to unwrap them)
- Bag of M&Ms and/or Pecans

#### Instructions

- Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- Line a baking sheet with parchment paper.
- Put a single layer of pretzels down.
- Put an unwrapped Rolo in the center of each pretzel.
- Bake for 3-5 mins--the Rolos should be soft but not melted.
- As soon as they come out of the oven, gently squish the top with a candy or a pecan.
- Allow to cool and then enjoy.
- Store in an airtight container.










#### CAMPUS FEATURE: ADVICE FROM A TUTOR



Major: Mechanical Engineering (B.S.)

Hometown: Audubon PA [originally from New Delhi, India]

<u>Question:</u> As a Learning Center Tutor, what advice do you have for students to succeed in an entirely remote learning environment?

"Remote learning comes with a lot of pros and cons. It helps students to manage their time more flexibly and concentrate on individual priorities. This remote setting gives a little bit of freedom to edit our schedule. Specifically, we don't have to hurry to class or rush back from an in-person class to join the online class. But remote learning also comes with many challenges with students struggling to understand the material, having a hard time finding the motivation to learn, and the lack of social aspect of college. My advice to students is...

- Find something interesting to learn about and work on in your courses to increase motivation.
- Eat well, work out, have some fun time with loved ones.
- Take multiple breaks to relax between work sessions.
- Talk to classmates over the break, trust me, discussing your shared experience can help let off steam.
- Make use of the Learning and Writing Centers
