



#### FAFSA for 2022-2023 opened October 1, 2021!

File your FAFSA by clicking here!

- Remember to have your 2020 taxes!
- PA residents: Submit **BEFORE** May 1st, 2022 to be considered for PHEAA PA State Grant!

If you have not accepted Federal Direct loans or Alternative loans that you'd like to use towards your bill, you must do that ASAP!!

- For first time loans borrowers of the Federal Direct loans, you must also complete these two items:
  - Sign your MPN
  - Complete Entrance Counseling



If you have not yet completed your verification for the 2021-2022 FAFSA (aid year 2022 in LionPATH), you could be at risk of losing your federal aid for the entire academic year.

- You MUST return all To Do List items in LionPATH to the Office of Student Aid (OSA) as soon as possible.
- Once OSA reviews your submitted materials, that MAY trigger new items for review.
- If the verification is not completed by the last week of classes, you will lose your federal aid for the year!
- If you have already completed the 2022-2023 FAFSA, you may begin to see verification requests on your To Do list (aid year of 2023 in LionPATH)

## INEXPENSIVE GIFT IDEA FOR ANYONE: DIY Candy Sleighs!

You are in for a treat with this "Do It Yourself" inexpensive gift idea!

#### To make each candy sleigh you'll need:

- 2 candy canes
- 1 four-finger KitKat bar or similar sized candy bar that will fit on the candy canes
- Several pieces of small or fun-size chocolate candy
- Glue or double sided tape
- OPTIONAL: Christmas ribbon, reindeer or santa chocolate, etc. (for step 4)
- 1. For the base, glue two candy canes under the KitKat or candy bar of choice- on the left and right side.
- 2. Next, you can stack 10 mini Hersey bars on top of the chocolate bar in a pyramid shape (first 4, then 3, then 2, then 1)
- 3. Now you need to wait until all the glue is dry and secure. You don't need to worry about the glue melting the chocolate because a glue gun uses relatively low heat glue.
- 4. To accessorize the sleigh, glue ribbon around the candy bars or you can also glue a reindeer eraser, reindeer chocolate, or even a reindeer sticker to the front of the sleigh for a more realistic sleigh-look. Another thing you can do: Glue a Santa eraser, a Santa chocolate bar, or even a Santa sticker to the front of the chocolate stack.
- 5. Voila! Now your candy sleigh is ready to take off!
