What is a Division Head?

- At Penn State Berks, academic departments (i.e., different majors and programs) fall within one of three divisions. Each division is led by a Division Head.
- The Division Heads are Berks faculty that teach, conduct research, provide leadership for the Berks campus, oversee the faculty in their disciplines, and help resolve student concerns related to relevant academic programs/majors.
- Students can reach out to the Division Heads at any time to find out more about the division, learn about related research opportunities, or express any academic concerns about their program, major, or courses.

FUTURE COURSE ENROLLMENT

SUMMER 2023 COURSES

Summer Sessions:

Summer I: May 15 - June 26 Summer II: June 28 - August 11

- Schedule summer classes at any Penn State campus!
- Stay on track towards degree completion by speaking with your academic adviser before enrolling!
- IMPORTANT!
 - Most summer courses are accelerated, covering about 15 weeks of content in 6 to 7 weeks.
 - You can expect the pace of the course to be quick, with some classes meeting more frequently or for longer periods of time.
 - On-campus housing is not available for those taking summer courses at the Berks campus.
 - o Contact Financial Aid to determine if you might be eligible for aid.

 - If you decide to take classes at a non-Penn State location over the summer, make sure the credits will transfer back to Penn State! Use the Transfer Credit Tool to confirm.

Advising Meetings March 15 12:15pm - 1:15pm



- Advising Meetings are designed to help students learn more about majors, opportunities (scholarships, travel, etc.), and course scheduling information. Locations vary by major. See the full list here or scan the QR code above
- **SCHEDULING CLASSES:** Check your LionPATH Student "Home Base" (i.e., your dashboard) for an Enrollment Appointment date and to review the schedule of courses. Remember, enrollment dates vary by student.
 - Priority Registration begins March 15
 - Regular Registration begins March 22

IMPORTANT!

- Sophomores should have their change of major and change of campus (if applicable), completed prior to scheduling Fall classes!
- Any Holds for the Spring 2023 semester should be resolved prior to assigned enrollment date to prevent issues when scheduling courses.

There are various reasons why a student might decide to transition to a different Penn State campus. Typically, if a student applies for a major that is not offered at the student's current location, the student will be required to select an approved location during the entrance to major process. - Reach out to your instructor to discuss your status in the course and determine strategies to improve.
- Schedule tutoring sessions as necessary. See page 6 for tutoring information.
- Meet with your academic adviser to determine a plan of action should you fail or need to drop the course.
- Explore new ways of learning. This may include
 - Reading the material more often.
 - Completing practice problems.
 - Making a practice test.
 - Creating a study group.
 - Speaking the material aloud.
 - Switching up note-taking habits (e.g., using pen and paper versus computer).

FINANCIAL AID UPDATES & REMINDERS

FAFSA FAST FACTS 2023-2024

- The 2023-24 FAFSA application **opened on Oct. 1**.
- The FAFSA must be **completed annually**.
- In order to access the FAFSA application, you'll need your **FSA ID and password**.
- To complete the 2023-24 FAFSA, you'll need **2021** tax documents.
- Completing the FAFSA early can lead to improved odds of securing more FREE aid (i.e., grants and scholarships).
- After you've completed the FAFSA, monitor LionPATH for **Holds or To Do List Items** which may prevent aid from disbursing.
- Click the FAFSA icon to access the 2023-24 application.





VERIFICATION

If you have already completed the 2023-24 FAFSA, you may see verification requests in LionPATH. The requests will be for the aid year of 2024. Upload required documents to the Office of Student Aid as soon as possible to begin the review process. Doing so will prevent any aid issues in the Fall 2023 semester. SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

SUMMER SUCCESS SCHOLARSHIP

- Penn State's Summer Success Scholarship helps students who have fallen behind in their degree program and would benefit from taking a summer course at Penn State to get caught up but have financial challenges to doing so.
- The scholarship is available to students at all Penn State campuses.
- Students who receive the scholarship will receive \$2,000 toward their summer tuition. Eligibility requirements apply.

FACTS: MINOR & CERTIFICATE

- The Spanish Minor requires six 3-credit courses. The Certificate requires four 3-credit courses.
- The 4-course Certificate may be completed as part of or independent from the Spanish Minor—all Certificate courses will count towards the Minor!
- You do not need to be enrolled in a major or as a full-time student to complete the Certificate.
- This Certificate is available to working professionals.

Courses in either program may be started after completing Spanish 3 (or equivalent by credit transfer or exam).

A BERKS BITE: SAVORY BREAKFAST COOKIES



INGREDIENTS

- 4 oz breakfast sausage
- ½ onion, finely minced
- 34 cup flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon pepper
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten
- 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese, divided
- 1 tablespoon Parmesan cheese
- 1/8 teaspoon dried parsley

INSTRUCTIONS

- Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper.
- Heat a non-stick skillet over medium heat and cook sausage until crumbly (3-5 minutes).
- Add in the onion and continue cooking. Stir and break up the sausage until it is no longer pink.
- Transfer sausage and onion mixture to a paper towel-lined plate and drain.
- Meanwhile, combine flour, baking powder, salt, pepper, Parmesan cheese, and parsley in a large bowl; whisking until well combined.
 - Whisk in eggs.
 - Add 3/4 cup Cheddar cheese.
 - Spoon in sausage and onion mixture.
 - o Mix to form a thick batter.
- Make 'cookies' by scooping out about a 1/4 cup of the mixture and dropping onto the prepared baking sheet.
 - Sprinkle each 'cookie' with Cheddar cheese and slightly flatten with your fingers.
- Bake in the preheated oven until firm (about 10 minutes). If cookie is still a little soft, cook for an additional 2 minutes.
- Remove from the oven and allow to cool slightly before serving.
