Penn State Berks Outdoor Program Adventures provide a unique experience where incoming first-year students can make connections, enjoy summer activities, and feel better prepared to start their college career.

These adventure programs are coupled with Penn State's First-Year Seminar course. All Penn State students are required to take First-Year Seminar and student participants of the Outdoor Adventure Programs will have the benefit of taking this course with other students they have already met.

Due to limited space for each adventure program, registration is on a first-come, first-served basis. In order to participate, students will be required to sign a release.
